Purpose of the Consultancy

UNFPA is seeking an International Psychosocial Support (PSS) Trainer Consultant to support the UNFPA country office, GBViE Programme.

The International Psychosocial Support Trainer consultant will facilitate capacity building of UNFPA's Implementing Partners that were providing PSS interventions prior to August 2021 in Women Friendly Health Spaces (WFHSs) and Psychosocial Counselling Centers (PSCCs) for the purpose of capacity strengthening.

The duties of the International Psychosocial Trainer consultant will be to ensure a successful roll-out of PSS training for Implementing partner staff.
